



Have you heard of Joanne Rowling? She wrote the famous *Harry Potter* books. Joanne was born in England in 1965.


When she was a little girl, Joanne loved making up stories. She told the stories to her younger sister, Dianne. The first story she wrote down was a story about a rabbit.
