## <3. RLC: Reading, Listening, Comprehension>

- 50分レッスンの場合は後半がRLCです。TEDトークの”Matt Cutts: Try Something New for 30 Days”を題材に、当校の音読トレーニングを実施します。難しいかもしれませんが、レベル判定後、適切な教材をご紹介しますのでご安心ください。リピーティングやシャドウイングのやり方を体感下さい。
- 英語4技能に大変効果のある英語脳を作り上げるトレーニングをご提供します。
- 「Comprehension Questions」ではこの文章を使って講師とQ&Aをしますので、ぜひ自分の意見を英語で述べて下さい。

## <4. Speaking Activity>

- The verb to dwell is to live somewhere. To be desk-dwelling means to be always staying at your desk.

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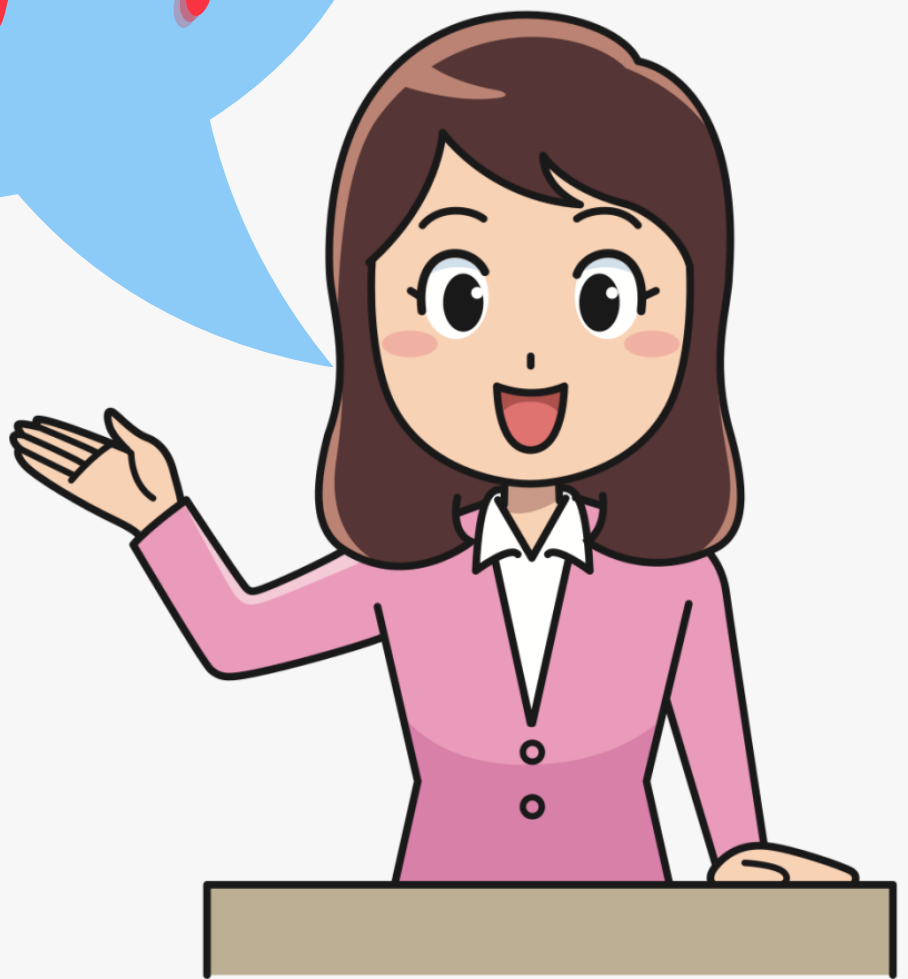

- to try to do (something).

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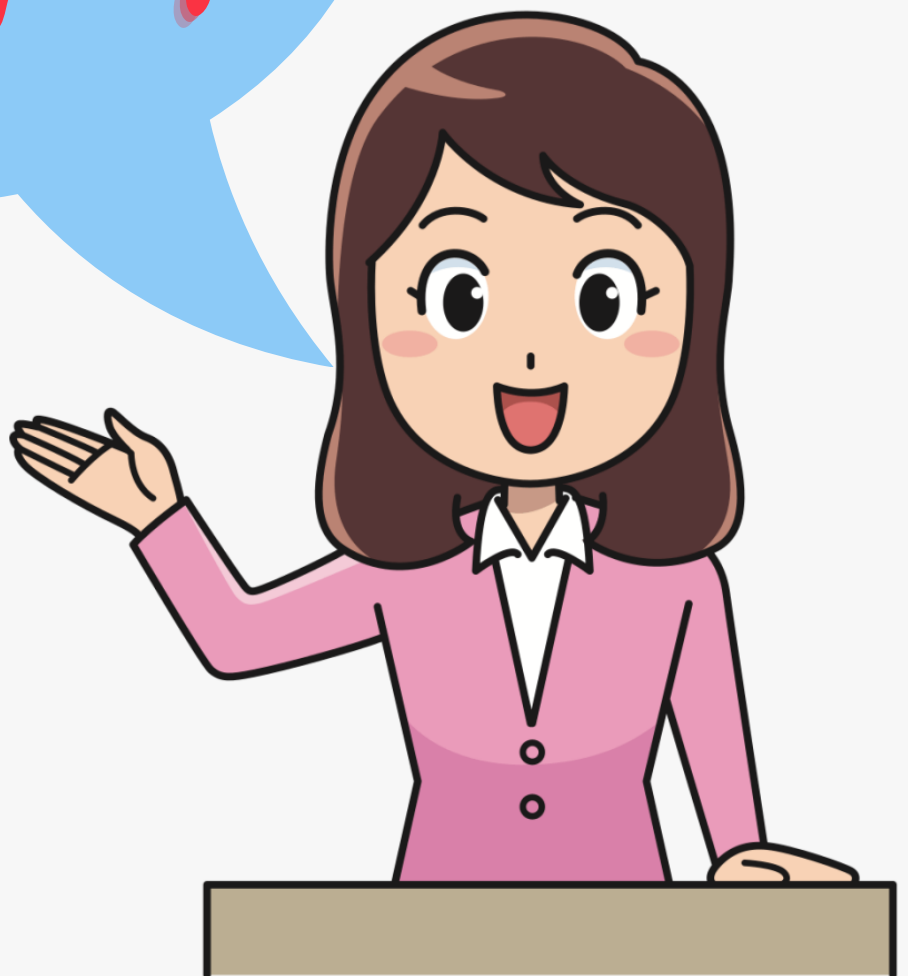
